ATTENTION ALL NURSING STUDENTS IN CLINICAL COURSES, FALL 2011: Clinical requirements for Fall 2011 must be RECEIVED at the Dept. of Nursing no later than July 1, 2011 for consideration for progression into clinical courses. Students beginning their first clinical course can pick up a packet of information at the Nursing Media Lab (MKN127). Students expecting to progress to their next clinical course must have documentation of current Professional Level CPR from the American Heart Association (BLS for the Healthcare Provider), tuberculin skin testing, proof of health insurance, and Child Abuse and Criminal Background checks. Updated results must be received at the Department of Nursing no later than July 1, 2011. Look in your nursing student mailbox for a list of the requirements you must update. If you do not comply with these PA State Board Regulations by this date you will have to withdraw from the clinical course for the Fall 2011 semester. Please note: Ability to register for the clinical course the following semester will be based on availability of space. NO EXCEPTIONS! WORD OF THE DAY: venal *VEE-nuL* adjective: capable of being bought or obtained for money or other valuable consideration; especially : open to corrupt influence and especially bribery: originating in, characterized by, or associated with corrupt bribery. The crusading journalist attempted to fight corruption in government by casting light on venal lawmakers and the special interests that whispered in their ears. "Kate Winslet gives an amazing performance in Todd Haynes' Mildred Pierce as a woman who uses her mind, indulges her sexual desires, yet can't begin to cope with her venal, betraying daughter." From a blog post by Caryn James on IndieWire, March 27, 2011. If you are given the choice between acts that are "venal" and those that are "venial," go for the venial. Although the two words look and sound alike, they have very different meanings and histories. "Venal" demonstrates the adage that anything can be had if the price is high enough and the morals are low enough. That word originated with the Latin "venum," which simply referred to something that was sold or for sale. Some of those transactions must have been rather shady, because by the mid-1600s, "venal" had gained the sense of corruption it carries today. "Venial" sins, on the other hand, are pardonable, the kind that show that everyone makes mistakes sometimes. That forgiving term descends from "venia," Latin for "favor," "indulgence," or "pardon."
